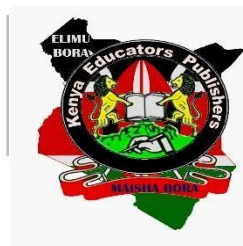

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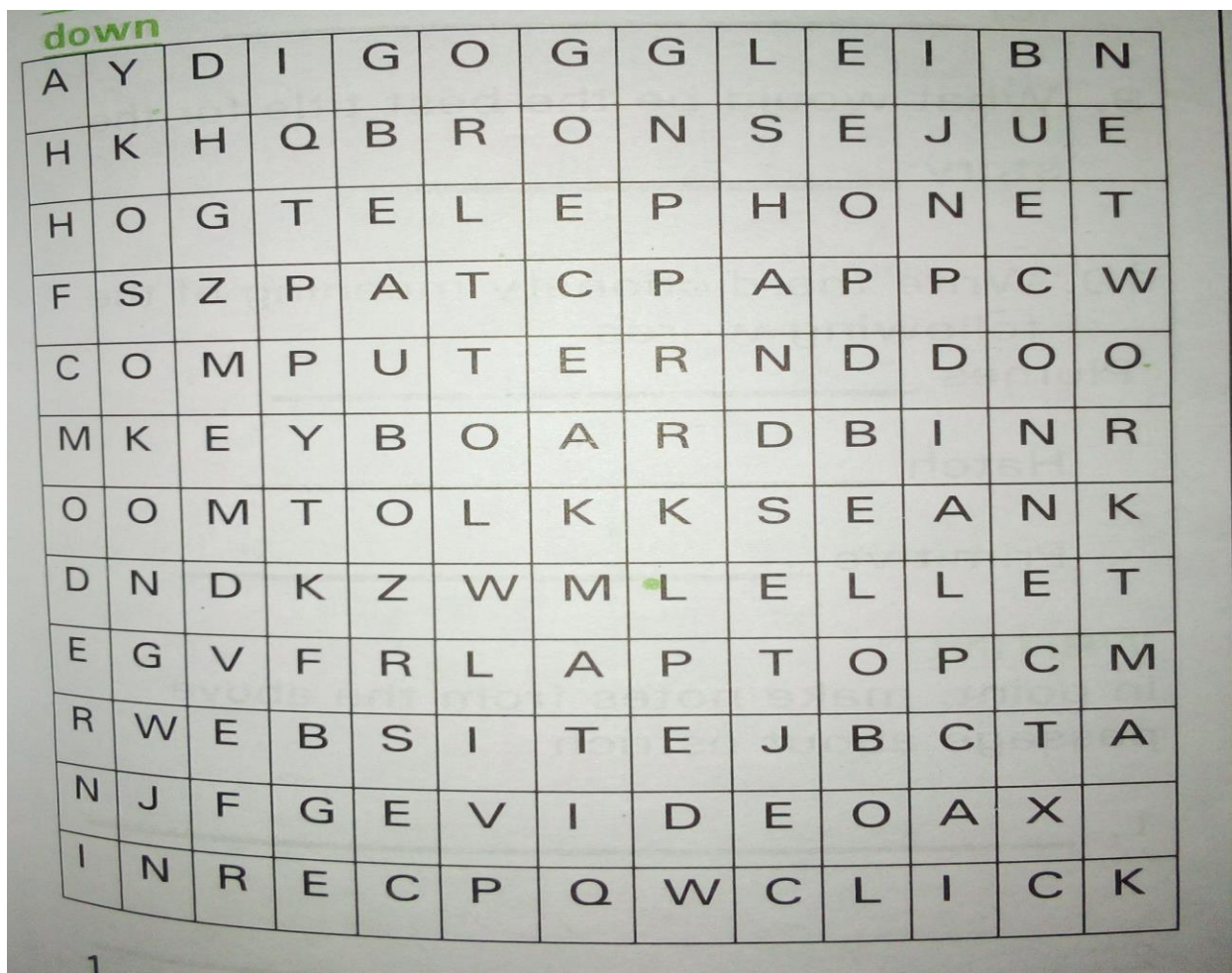

The tallest bird in the world today is the ostrich. A fully grown ostrich may stand nearly two and a half meters in height and weigh from 100- 150 kilograms. It relies on keen eyesight and powerful legs to escape from its enemies. An ostrich is a primitive bird whose wings have not been developed for flight. The nest of an ostrich consists of a shallow hole scraped out of the soil by the male bird. The female lays a dozen or more eggs and both male and female take turns in hatching them. The female sits on them during the day, and the male during the night. The eggs weigh about one and a half kilograms each and take six weeks to hatch. In their wild state, ostriches live mainly on coarse grasses but will also eat snakes, lizards, and insects. In captivity, they are fed on cloves and grains. To help their digestion they also swallow any kind of grit, glass, and pebbles. An ostrich that died at a zoo was found to have in its stomach nails, coins, bits of wits, gloves, and handkerchiefs.

Ever since the time of the ancient Egyptians, the long supple feathers of an ostrich have been used for adornment. Today there are farms in South Africa where the birds are reared for their plumes. Lately, the number of these farms is decreasing because the plumes are less fashionable than they were forty or fifty years ago.

It has been known for 200 years that crocodiles living in River Nile carry stones in their stomachs. A recent examination of sixty-one crocodiles in East and Central Africa has proved that they also carry stones and has shown the true purpose of the stones.

They do not help the crocodile to digest food or stop it from being hungry when food is scarce as many people thought. The purpose of the stones is to give the crocodiles extra weight. Young crocodiles under one year old do not usually contain stones but adults, whether they live in rivers or in muddy swamps always have plenty of stones inside them. The stones are not swallowed by accident while feeding. There is a proof that crocodiles often travel many miles to find stones to swallow.

In any adult crocodile, the stones weigh about one-hundredth part of the total weight of the crocodile. The heaviest load of stones found in crocodiles was eleven pounds. This was carried by an animal fifteen feet long. Eleven pounds may not seem very much extra weight for a large crocodile but it is sufficient to enable an adult crocodile to stay underwater without the risk of floating to the surface. Even in a very strong TioWing river, it can comfortably hold its position on the river bottom. But the baby crocodile with no stones cannot do this. It is obliged to use its legs to avoid rolling over and cannot always rest easy when underwater or when floating. It needs ballast.
