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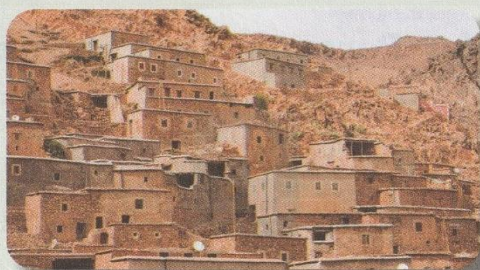

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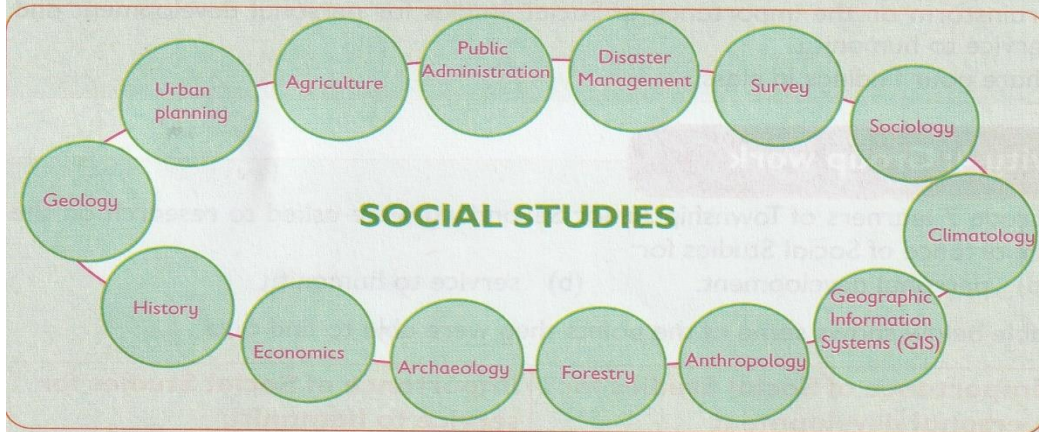

Some of the careers in Social Studies include working as a museum curator, land economist, lawyer, climatologist, urban planner, archaeologist, ecologist, pilots, among others.

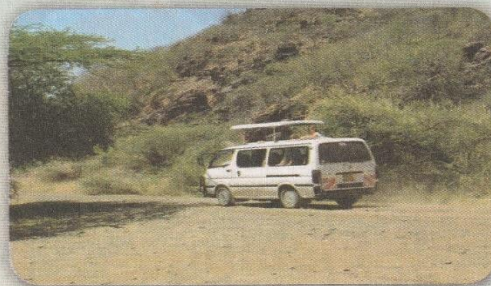

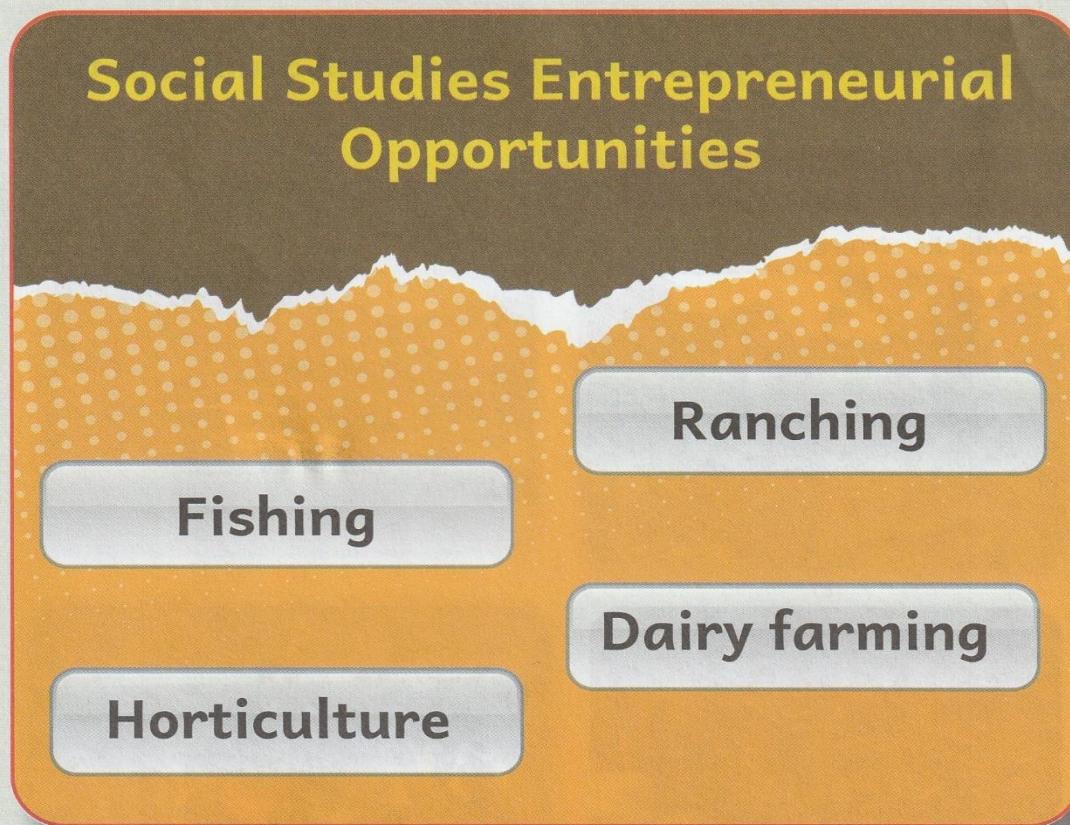

Appropriate Strategies for Addressing Gender Stereotypes Associated with Career Choices and Entrepreneurial Opportunities in Social Studies

A **strategy** is a careful plan or method of dealing with an issue. **Gender** is the state of being male or female in relation to social and cultural roles. **Stereotypes** are fixed general ideas or images that assume that a person behaves in a particular way. Stereotypes limit aspirations and development of talents. They create gender differences. These differences ought to be addressed using appropriate strategies.

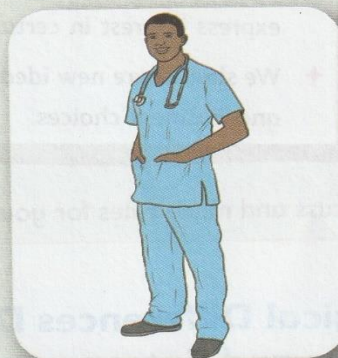

Key points

We can address gender stereotypes in career and entrepreneurial opportunities related to Social Studies through the following strategies:

- (a) Committing and encouraging both males and females to take a full range of careers and business opportunities.
- (b) Ensuring representation of both genders in leadership.
- (c) Treating both males and females equally by using texts and curricular that does not promote gender bias.
- (d) Develop policies, laws and decision making processes that represent both males and females.

Our Grade Seven Rules

- ✦ We will respect and listen to both boys and girls in their career choices.

- ✦ We shall not shout at, insult or shut down anyone when classmates express interest in certain careers or businesses of their choice.
- ✦ We shall share new ideas that discourage gender stereotypes in career and business choices.

Biological Differences Devoid of Stereotypes in Career Choices and Entrepreneurial Opportunities in Social Studies

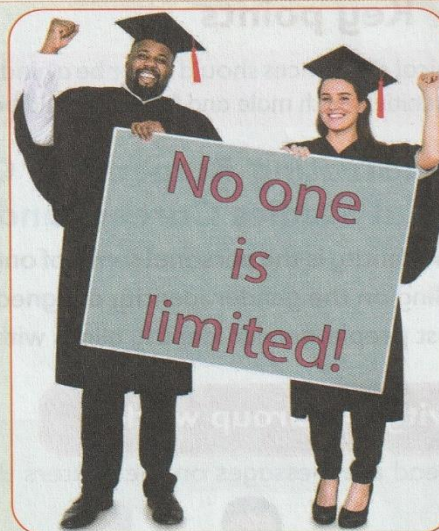

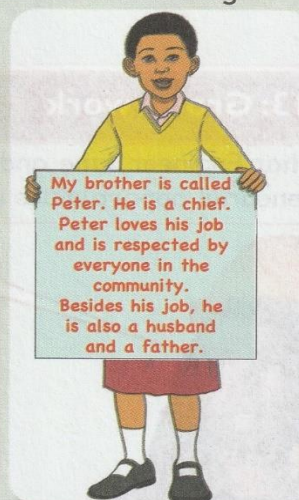
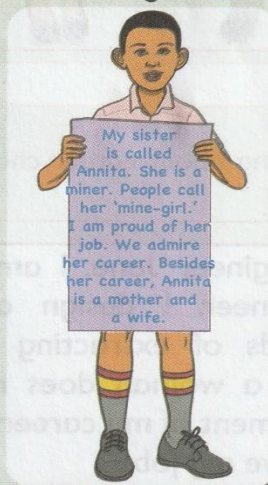
Biological differences should never be a hindrance to one's career choice and entrepreneurial opportunities. Both male and female should be given equal opportunities to pursue their dreams.

Demonstrating Respect for One's Gender Identity in Pursuit of Social Studies Careers and Entrepreneurial Opportunities

Gender identity is the personal sense of one's own gender. People may express themselves depending on the gender identity assigned to them. Gender identity is different from sex. For most people, gender identity aligns with the gender an individual was assigned at birth.

Key points

We should never discriminate against anyone because of gender. We can demonstrate respect for one's gender identity in pursuit of Social Studies careers and entrepreneurial opportunities through the following ways:

- (a) treating each other with respect regardless of gender and choice of careers or entrepreneurial opportunities;
- (b) complementing the achievements of others in their careers and entrepreneurial opportunities;
- (c) being gender responsive by taking actions to correct gender bias and discrimination.
- (d) ensuring that no one is mistreated, marginalised or discriminated against because of their gender.

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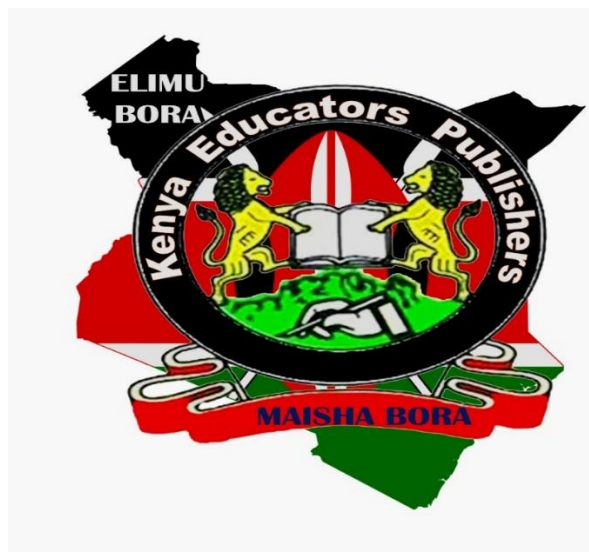
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
